Dangers in Colossae: First Century A.D.

1. One error threatening the Colossians was the failure to do justice to the person and work of Jesus Christ. (1:13-20)

2. Another danger arose from the influence of Philosophy (2:4-10; cf. verse 3)

 □ All the errors to which the Colossians were exposed were refuted by the all-sufficient Christ.

3. Yet another danger arose from the influence of those who insisted on the observance of rites and customs of the Jewish religion. (2:13-17, 20-23; cf. Acts 15:1; cf. Galatians, Romans, Hebrews)

Dangers in Colossae: First Century A.D.

4. The worship of angels was another danger of the false teaching to which the Colossians were exposed. (2:18-19)

- ☐ This all-sufficient Christ dwells in Christians and influences their action in the various relationships of life
- A. Christ dwells in the Christian. (1:27 "Christ in you, the hope of glory") (cf. Gal. 2:20)1. Christ dwells in Jews and Gentiles alike. (cf. Eph. 3:6)

- Regarding our moral and ethical conduct, certain things are to be put to death and put off and certain things are to be put on. (3:5-17; cf. Eph., 4:25,28-29)

- "Christ in you" will be reflected in home life (3:18-21)
- A. The woman's role is a role of quiet subjection and not a place of prominence or display.
 - 1. 1 Cor. 11:3; 1 Pet. 3:1; reason in 1 Tim. 2:13 and 1 Cor. 11:8-9.
 - 2. Eph. 5:22-24, 33. Respect.
 - 3. NOTE: In both Ephesians and Colossians the command to wives is followed by the expression, "Husbands love your wives." cf. 1 Pet. 3:7.

B. The role of the husband is to be the loving leader. "Leave and cleave..." Gen. 2:24; cf. Eph. 5:25-29

C. Children are to obey their parents.

Prov. 6:20 "My Son, keep thy father's commandment, and forsake not the law of thy mother."

Rom. 1:30 One of the many sins Paul listed here is "disobedient to parents."

Eph. 6:1 Paul sums up the whole matter ... "Children, obey your parents in the Lord: for this is right."

- cf. Prov. 13:1 "A wise son heareth his father's instruction, but a scoffer heareth not rebuke."
- Prov. 15:5 "A fool despiseth his father's correction; but he that regardeth reproof getteth prudence."
- Prov. 15:10 "There is grievous correction for him that forsaketh the way; and he that hateth reproof shall die."
- 1 Kings 12 illustrates those young people who forsake the counsel of their parents and the counsel of other adults who have more years to learn.
- DO NOT FORGET TO LEARN TO WORK. Lam. 3:27 "It is good for a man that he bears the yoke in his youth."

- Fathers must also provide training & discipline for his children.
- Prov. 13:24 "He that spareth the rod hateth his son;, but he that loveth him chasteneth him betimes."

Servants are to be obedient.

Masters are to be fair and just.

"Christ in you" will be reflected in social life. (4:5-6); Acts 2:47; Phil. 2:14-16; Mt. 5:13-16
