Psalms 34: 11-14 -

Come you children, listen to me; I will teach you the fear of the Lord.

Who is the man who desires life, And loves many days, that he may see good?

Keep your tongue from evil, and your lips from speaking deceit. Depart from evil and do good. Seek peace and pursue it.

What is a Good Life?

Do we consider that we have a good life based on what we have or what we accomplish?

Ecclesiastes 5:10 – "He who loves silver will not be satisfied with silver; nor he who loves abundance with increase. This also is vanity."

Rather a "good life" is seen in one's character; what one **IS** and not what one **HAS**.

Luke 12:15 – "Take heed and beware of covetousness, for one's life does not consist in the abundance of the things he passesses."
