- Ruler of the Jews. John 3:1; 7:50
- A teacher of Israel. John 3:10
- Asked for the body of Jesus. John 19:39

Entering The Kingdom

Who Shall **NOT** Enter The Kingdom? Matthew 5:20

- "Say and do not." Matthew 23:2-3
- Must "do." Matthew 5:19-20; Acts 10:34-35
- Those who trust in riches. Mark 10:23-27; Luke 12:13-21; Matthew 19:16-22
- Those who follow the works of the flesh.
- Galatians 5:19
- The unrighteous. 1 Corinthians 6:9-11; cf. Acts 18:8

Entering The Kingdom

Who SHALL Enter The Kingdom?

- John 3:5, "Except one <u>be born of water and **the**</u> <u>Spirit</u>, he cannot enter into the kingdom of God!"
- "Begotten" (1 Peter 1:23; 1 Corinthians 4:15; James 1:18; cf. Luke 8:11; cf. "rebirth" in Titus 3:5)
 - Starting all over!
- cf. Ezekiel 36:22-31 Complete transformation necessary to receive the blessings of God.
 cf. Jeremiah 31:31ff

Entering The Kingdom Who SHALL Enter The Kingdom?

- John 3:5, "Except one <u>be born of water and the Spirit</u>, he cannot enter into the kingdom of God!"
- Nicodemus should have known that a physical birth was not all that made him God's elect! Verses 7, 10
 - There was the necessity of circumcision. Genesis 17
 - As David affirmed, a new heart was required!
 - Psalms 51:10, "Create in me a clean heart, O God; and renew a right spirit within me."
 - Psalms 51:17, "The sacrifices of God are a broken spirit: a broken and a contrite heart, o God, thou wilt not despise."
 - Without that new heart, even the Jew was not acceptable to Jehovah!

Entering The Kingdom

Who SHALL Enter The Kingdom?

- John 3:5, "Except one <u>be born of **water** and the Spirit</u>, he cannot enter into the kingdom of God!"
- Baptism puts one "into Christ" in Galatians 3:27 (as in Romans 6:3-4). "New creatures"
 2 Corinthians 5:17
- Baptism "washes away sins." Acts 22:16
- Baptism is "unto remission of sins." Acts 2:38
- Baptism "saves us." 1 Peter 3:21

Entering The Kingdom

Who SHALL Enter The Kingdom?

- Matthew 18:3, "Except ye <u>turn (be converted KIV), and become as</u> <u>little children</u>, ye shall in no wise enter into the kingdom of heaven."
- From unbelief to believing. John 8:24; Mark 16:16; Hebrews 11:6
- From impenitent to penitent. Luke 13:3; Acts 17:30; Romans 2:6-8
- From disobedient to obedient. Hebrews 5:8-9; 2 Thessalonians 1:7-9
- RESULTS: Like a little child. (Humble, loving, obedient, forgiving, etc.)

Entering The Kingdom

Who SHALL Enter The Kingdom?

- Matthew 7:21, "Not every one that saith unto me, Lord, Lord, shall enter into the kingdom of heaven; <u>but he that doeth the will of my Father</u> who is in heaven."
- Obedience: cf. Matthew 17:5
 - Children. Ephesians 6:1; Exodus 20:12
 - Us. Matthew 28:18-20; Mark 16:15-16; Luke 24:46-47

Entering The Kingdom

- Conclusion:
 - Saved ones are delivered, translated, transformed, changed, "out of the power of darkness, and translated us into the kingdom of the Son of his love" (Colossians 1:13)

Entering The Kingdom

- John 3:5, "Except one be born of water and the Spirit, he cannot enter into the kingdom of God!"
- Conclusion:
- The same act of **Baptism** that saves the believer (Mark 16:16; 1 Peter 3:21), so that the Lord adds him to His church (Acts 2:47), and that puts the believer from "without" the body to "into the body" (1 Corinthians 12:13), and from "without" Christ to being "in Christ" (Galatians 3:26-27), is the act that "translates," "changes" him from "without" to "into the kingdom" of Christ.
