2 Timothy 4:9-12

### Hearts grow cold gradually

How did the Christians in Laodicea become "lukewarm" (Revelation 3:16)?

• Their fervor for the Lord gradually faded even as a hot beverage slowly becomes lukewarm

How did the Christians in **Ephesus** leave "their first love" (Revelation 2:4-5)? Did they just "fall" out of love?

· No love ever fails overnight!

#### Hearts grow cold gradually

**How is it** that some become lukewarm or leave their first love?

- 1. We lose focus Colossians 3:1-2, Hebrews 12:1-2; Amos 6:1, Luke 12:19
- 2. We don't pay attention 1 Timothy 4:16; 2 Peter 1:19
- 3. We forget Titus 2:14, 2 Peter 1:9 (verses 12-15).
- **4. We get tired and weary** Hebrews 12:12-13; Isaiah 40:28-31; 2 Corinthians 4:7-12, 16-18
- 5. We fall victim to the  $\sin$  and wickedness around us Matthew  $24{:}12$

The solution is to think about Jesus (Hebrews 12:1-3), "sow to the spirit" (Galatians 6:8-9), and learn to rely upon God and His strength (2 Corinthians 12:7-10).

### Christians fall away gradually

The sin of drifting – Hebrews 2:1, "... we must pay much closer attention ... lest we **drift away** from it."

- · A gradual process in which one slowly leaves a point of reference by gliding or flowing by.
- The English word is defined as "to wander from a set course or point of attention; stray."

We fail to pay attention to the current of the "course of this world" (Ephesians 2:2).

We fail to take note of our daily choices and decisions like whether to read and study God's word - 2 Timothy 2:15; 1 Timothy 4:13; 1 Thessalonians 5:17

 $\dots$  Leads to no longer worshipping as we ought. Hebrews  $10{:}24{\cdot}25$ 

### Weeds gradually choke out the good seed

Jesus referred to the ability of **the cares of this** world to **slowly overtake** our spiritual life in Mark 4:7, 18-19.

God's word warns of being "entangled" again in the sin we escape from ... or other things not sinful. (2 Peter 2:20; 2 Timothy 2:4; Hebrews 12:1)

We must continually examine ourselves to make sure that we are not slowly falling in love with "the world, (or) the things in the world" (1 John 2:15).

What are we worried and bothered about? (Luke 10:41-42)

## Sin, left unchecked, will gradually spread amongst brethren.

Sin has the potential to act as leaven among Christians. 1 Corinthians 5:6-7

The "spiritual" need to look for those walking according to the flesh and seek to "restore" such a one, looking to ourselves also. Galatians 6:1

Becoming "hardened by the deceitfulness of sin" (Hebrews 3:13) is a gradual thing ... hardened because punishment didn't immediately follow (Ecclesiastes 8:11; cf., 2 Peter 3:9, 14-15)

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# False teaching will gradually spread amongst brethren unless silenced.

Paul warned Timothy to "avoid" (or "shun") the "talk" of men who have "gone astray from the truth" that will "spread like gangrene." 2 Timothy 2/:16-17

Paul would not give place to such false teachers in Galatia "for even an hour, so that the truth of the gospel might remain with you." Galatians 2:5

Thus false teaching is to be "exposed" (Ephesians 5:11) and those who propagate such are to be "silenced" (Titus 1:10-11) with great urgency (Jude 3; Galatians 2:5) and love. Ephesians 4:14

"In season and out of season ..." 2 Timothy 4:2

### We attain spiritual maturity gradually.

Spiritual growth is a life-long endeavor that is to happen day by day. A continual "renewal" process (2 Corinthians 4:16).

Completeness and maturity take time, but growth is expected. "For though by this time..." (Hebrews 5:12)

Life is always a matter of growth or default (2 Peter 3:17)

We are to be ever increasing in spiritual virtues (2 Peter 1:5-8).

Growth that continues to "... a mature man, to the measure of the stature which belongs to the fulness of Christ" (Ephesians 4:13) ... a process that takes all of our lives.

## We win the "crown of life" by gradually pressing on.

Paul understood that each day he had to "press on toward the goal" (Philippians 3:14).

It's a race that has to be **run with endurance** (cf. 1 Corinthians 9:24-25, Hebrews 12:1-2)

A lot of daily battles to be fought. 1 Timothy 6.11

Have we "done everything" (Ephesians 6:13)?

A lot of daily sacrifices. Luke 9:23

## What isn't to take place gradually?

Our obedience to the gospel. Acts 22:16, "And now why do you delay? Arise, and be baptized, and wash away your sins, calling on His name."

The need to repent is not to take place gradually but rather is to take place immediately in regards to all that we understand to be a sin and offense before God.

We read of Simon in Acts 8:22-24 who immediately sought the prayers of his brethren for the sin he had committed.

Obedience is to exercised "today." 2 Corinthians 6:2
