
Leaving Waterpots Behind

Woman at the Well

> Review of events

- Jesus, on His way to Galilee, stops outside Sychar, having become hungry and thirsty; disciples go on into town seeking food
- A woman approaches to draw water; Jesus begins discussion of "living water"; requests she summon her husband
- She concludes He is a prophet; He indicates that He is the Messiah
- O She runs into the town to inform others



Woman at the Well

- > Review of events
- > But why did she leave her waterpot?
 - o Probably did not have an abundance of them
 - o Probably didn't forget it
 - May have been an inexpensive pot

Because she found something more valuable than water or a waterpot and it had become a hindrance to her new goal; she left it to pursue what was more valuable!



Waterpots We Need to Leave Behind

 - Academics
- o Possessions
- Accomplishments

 - O Do we prepare ourselves to teach the lost?
 - ✓ Carry church business cards
 - ✓ Have Bible Correspondence courses available
 - ✓ Study/learn an organized method for presenting the gospel
