The Problem Of Self

Self-Service Is the Problem

- Self is the obstacle to serving the Lord.
- Judges 21:25 Every man did what was right in his own eyes.
- Matthew 23:25 The hypocrite is selfish.
- Acts 24:25 Must learn temperance, self-control.
- Romans 2:8 Those who do not obey are selfseeking.
- Galatians 2:20 No longer I (self), but Christ.
- James 3:13-14 Those who do not follow the
- wisdom from above are self-seeking.

The Problem Of Self

Self-Service Is the Problem

Temptation appeals to our own desires.

- James 1:14 drawn away by own desires.
- I John 2:15-17:
 - Lust of the flesh appeals to what I like and want.
 Lust of the eyes appeals to what I want to see.
- Pride of life appeals to my view of myself.
- 1 Corinthians 7:5 Satan tempts us in our lack of self-control.

The Problem Of Self

Self-Service Is the Problem

- Constant battle over self.
- Self-denial deals with the reality of life.
 1 Corinthians 6:9-11; cf. 1 Corinthians 5

- Passages that deal with it in principle. Romans 6:12ff ; Galatians 2:20; Ephesians 5:24

The Problem Of Self

Self-Denial Is The Answer

Passages that forbid anything require selfdenial.

- Lust. 2 Timothy 2:22; Matthew 5:28
- Lying. Ephesians 4:25
- Immorality. 1 Corinthians 6:18
- Laziness. 2 Thessalonians 3:10; Lamentations 3:27
- Retaliation. Romans 12:17-21

Self-Denial Is The Answer

Any passage that commands anything, requires it.

- Gentleness. 2 Timothy 2:24
- Forbearing (patience). 2 Timothy 2:24
- Contentment. Hebrews 13:5
- Love. Romans 12:9-10
