Conflicting Messages Ignored

Zedekiah

- Jews had undergone 2 deportations (605 & 597 BC) and were about to undergo a 3rd (586 BC)
- Daniel, Hananiah, Mishael, & Azariah left in the first deportation, Ezekiel in the second
- Jeremiah remained in Jerusalem

Conflicting Messages Ignored

> Zedekiah

... Zedekiah king of Judah shall not escape out of the hand of the Chaldeans, but shall surely be given into the hand of the king of Babylon, and shall speak with him face to face and see him eye to eye ...

- Jeremiah 32:4

And I will spread My net over him, and he shall be taken in My snare. And I will bring him to Babylon, the land of the Chaldeans, yet he shall not see it, and he shall die there.

- Ezekiel 12:13

Conflicting Messages Ignored

> Zedekiah

... Then they captured the king and brought him up to the king of Babylon at Riblah, and they passed sentence on him. They slaughtered the sons of Zedekiah before his eyes, and put out the eyes of Zedekiah and bound him in chains and took him to Babylon.

> Ahab

Now therefore behold, the Lord has put a lying spirit in the mouth of all these your prophets; the Lord has declared disaster for you. - I Kings 22:20, 23






Example of Abraham


- Through Isaac he would be the father of many nations

By faith Abraham, when he was tested, offered up Isaac, and he who had received the promises was in the act of offering up his only son, of whom it was said, "Through Isaac shall your offspring be named." He considered that God was able even to raise him from the dead, from which, figuratively speaking, he did receive him back.
