- In his defense before the council Acts 23:1
- In his defense before Felix Acts 24:15-16
- In his last epistle to Timothy 2 Timothy 1:3

The Role Our Conscience Plays Is Often Misunderstood...

- Some assume it is to be the final authority for what you do. Proverbs 14:12;
 cf. Colossians 3:17; Matthew 21:23ff
- "Let your conscience be your guide" is the motto for many.
- > Yet, your conscience can sometimes lead you astray!

The Value of a Good Conscience Is Perhaps Often Overlooked...

- Some do not listen to their conscience when they should. cf. 1 Corinthians 8:7
- Some think nothing of the consequences of violating their conscience.
 cf. 1 Corinthians 8:8-13
- > Yet, ignoring your conscience can lead to sin, unbelief, and apostasy!

The Conscience Defined

 "...that process of thought which <u>distinguishes</u> what it considers morally good or bad, commending the good, condemning the bad, and so prompting to do the former, and to avoid the latter." – (W.E. Vine – <u>Dictionary of N.T. Words</u>)

The Conscience Defined

- Note: Conscience is a process of thought that distinguishes, i.e. makes moral judgments.
- Conscience must be properly taught. cf. Hebrews 5:11-14
 - Knowledge: Hebrews 5:12
 - Experience: Hebrews 5:13
- Properly trained conscience will appreciate and understand what is true & reject what is false.

The Conscience May Not Always Be A Reliable Guide...

- Paul had served God with a good conscience throughout his life – Acts 23:1
- Even at a time when he was persecuting Christians! – cf. Acts 26:9-11

The Conscience May Not Always Be A Reliable Guide...

Important questions:

- 1. Is what we **consider** morally good or bad **actually** good or bad?
- 2. Are our judgments based upon God's absolute truths, or our own think so? (cf. Proverbs 14:12)
- 3. Has our conscience been properly set?

Good Conscience Commanded

- 1 Timothy 1:5 "But the end of the charge is love out of a pure heart and a good conscience and faith unfeigned."
- 1 Timothy 3:9 "holding the mystery of the faith in a pure conscience."

The Conscience Developed

How A Pure Conscience Is Made Possible...

- We are all sinners, so how can we possibly have a pure conscience? cf. Romans 3:23; Isaiah 59:1-2
- A clean conscience is made possible <u>through Jesus'</u> <u>blood</u> cf. Romans 3:23-26
 - Old Testament sacrifices and ordinances were insufficient – Hebrews 9:6-10; cf. 10:1-4
 - The blood of Jesus can cleanse one's conscience Hebrews 9:11-14; cf. 1 Peter 3:21

Baptism And "The Answer Of A Good Conscience" 1 Peter 3:21 (NKJV)

- "...the craving for a conscience right with God" (Goodspeed)
- "...the prayer for a clean conscience before God" (Moffat)
- "...the request unto God for a good conscience" (Rotherham)
- "...an appeal to God for a clear conscience" (RSV)
- "...an appeal to God for a good conscience" (NASV)
- "...the interrogation of a good conscience toward God" (ASV)

Consistent With The Purpose Of Baptism

- Baptism was "for the remission of sins," to have one's sins "washed away" (by the blood of Christ) – cf. Acts 2:38; 22:16
- Therefore, people in N.T. times who realized they were sinners were anxious to be baptized as soon as possible
 - Acts 2 Jews on Pentecost
 - Acts 8:12 Samaritans
 - Acts 8:35-38 Eunuch
 - Acts 16:33-34 Jailor

Consistent With The Purpose Of Baptism

- To have our conscience "cleansed" by the blood of Christ – (cf. Hebrews 9:14 ASV)
- One is baptized so their sins can be washed away. (Acts 22:16)
- They can rise to a new life through the same power of God that raised Jesus from the dead. (Romans 6:3-4)
- Thus, **in baptism** we make an appeal for a good conscience, trusting that the blood of Jesus will wash away our sins **cf. Acts 2:38; 22:16**

How A Pure Conscience Is Maintained

- <u>A Good Conscience Is Maintained By Obedience</u> <u>To God's Will</u>.
- Note that failure to do what we know is right is sinful – James 4:17
- Failure to abstain from what we know is wrong is also sinful – 1 John 3:4
- Right conduct with godly sincerity makes for a good conscience – cf. 2 Corinthians 1:12; cf. 2 Corinthians 7:10-11

The Conscience Destroyed

Much Harm Can Be Done To The Conscience.

- We can violate our conscience, which is sinful – Romans 14:22-23
- We can defile our conscience, leading to unbelief – Titus 1:15
- We can sear our conscience, leading to apostasy – 1 Timothy 4:1-2

The Conscience Destroyed

Ignoring Or Violating The Conscience Is Dangerous

- A guilty conscience can soon lead to a hardened conscience.
 - cf. Once our conscience is hardened regarding attendance
 cf. Hebrews 10:25 ... it is more likely to become hardened against doing what is right in other areas.
- A hardened conscience can lead to a heart of unbelief cf. Hebrews 3:12
 - The deceitfulness of sin hardens one's heart.
 - A hard heart can begin to question what one once believed.

Brethren, can we say...

- "Pray for us: for we are persuaded that we have a good conscience, desiring to live honorably in all things." Hebrews 13:18
- "I thank God, whom I serve ... with a pure conscience ..." 2 Timothy 1:3

- If not, and our conscience has not yet become so hardened that we will not heed, then we need to...
- Come to God's Son for the cleansing of our conscience through His blood
- Come to God's Word for the proper understanding of what is actually right and wrong
- Come to **God's Family** through frequent assembling to exhort us to do what is good
- If we reject faith and a good conscience, then the FAITH suffers shipwreck in our lives!

Note Paul's confidence. 2 Timothy 4:7

- That was because he strove to have a good conscience Acts 24:16
- That was because he lived by faith Galatians 2:20

Conclusion:

- Are you fighting the good fight?
- Are you keeping the faith?
- Or have you suffered shipwreck by rejecting faith and a good conscience?
