The Art Of Deception

- I Corinthians 3:18 "Let no man <u>deceive</u> himself. If any man thinketh that he is wise among you in this world, let him become a fool, that he may become wise."
- Ephesians 5:6 "Let no man <u>deceive</u> you with empty words: for because of these things cometh the wrath of God upon the sons of disobedience."
- 1 John 1:8 "If we say that we have no sin, we <u>deceive ourselves</u>, and the truth is not in us."

The Art Of Deception

- 1 Corinthians 6:9 "Or know ye not that the unrighteous shall not inherit the kingdom of God? Be not <u>deceived</u>: neither fornicators, nor idolaters, nor adulterers, nor effeminate, nor abusers of themselves with men."
- 1 Corinthians 15:33 "Be not <u>deceived</u>: Evil companionships corrupt good morals."
- Galatians 6:7 "Be not <u>deceived</u>; God is not mocked: for whatsoever a man soweth, that shall he also reap."

The Art Of Deception

2 Timothy 3:13 "But evil men and impostors shall wax worse and worse, <u>deceiving</u> and being <u>deceived</u>."

The Origin Of Deception

- In the garden of Eden. Satan. 1 Timothy 2:14; Genesis 3:1-6
- Drew Eve into a negotiation. Vs. 1, "Yea, hath God said?"
- Misquotes God from Genesis 2:16. (3:1)"Ye shall not of every tree..."(KJV)
- Denies the danger. (3:4) *"Ye shall not surely die ..."*, Jeremiah 23:17
- Promises advantage. (3:5) Eyes open, be as gods.
- Seeks to make God look unreasonable.

Manner In Which We Are Deceived

Sometimes contrary to our will. 1 Kings 13

- Young prophet was sincere, couldn't be bought.
- But he was deceived by someone else, a false prophet ... *"He lied to him."*
- Consequences still imposed.
- False teachers. Jeremiah 23; Romans 16:17-18; 2 Peter 2:20; 3:16

Manner In Which We Are Deceived

- <u>Sometimes according to our will</u>. Galatians 6:2-3; Isaiah 30:8-10; 2 Timothy 4:2-4
- I John 1:8 "If we say that we have no sin, we <u>deceive ourselves</u>, and the truth is not in us."

We Deceive Ourselves ...

By false thinking.

- Wishful thinking. Jeremiah 9:5; 37:9
- "a man thinketh himself to be something …" cf. Romans 12:3; Luke 18:10-14

We Deceive Ourselves ...

By not hearing carefully. James 1:21-22; Matthew 7:24-27

- Take heed what ye hear. Matthew 10:27
- Take heed how ye hear. Luke 8:18

We Deceive Ourselves ...

By not bridling our tongue. cf. James 1:26
Many times, instead of thinking and talking, we need to be listening. cf. Peter. Luke 22:31-34

We Deceive Ourselves ...

Misrepresenting our true condition.

- cf. Revelation 3:15-18
- Laodiceans thought they had it made ... "Rich and have gotten riches, and have need of nothing."
- "Knew not ..." God knows who and what we are.
- "Wretched, miserable, poor, blind, and naked."
- Thinking ourselves free from sin. cf. 1 John 1:8
- Need to "examine yourselves." 2 Corinthians 13:5

We Deceive Ourselves ...

<u>Comparing ourselves among ourselves</u>. 2 Corinthians 10:12

NOTE:

- Enoch & Noah, who walked with God. Genesis 5:22-24; Genesis 6
- Abraham. Father of the faithful, who obeyed God. Hebrews 11:9-10
- Moses. Wise choice. Hebrews 11:24ff
- Christ is the standard. Ephesians 4:13

We Deceive Ourselves ...

By thinking like a fool. Luke 12:13-21

- Left God out of his life.
- Left man out of his life.
- Made self the center of everything.
 "I", "My", "Me", "Mine."
- Confidence in material things.
 "Much goods laid up."
- Counted on time that was not his.
 Verse 19. *"Many years." cf. James 4:13-14*

God Cannot Be Deceived!

- <u>God is not mocked</u>. Galatians 6:7-8; Hebrews 4:12-13
- David tried to conceal his sin ... God knew.
 2 Samuel 11-12; Psalms 51:1-4
- Though David deceived others, God knew.
- God knows all. 1 Peter 3:12; Romans 2:16; Numbers 32:23

The Art Of Deception

- The Origin ... Satan.
- Manner ... Deceived by others.
- Manner ... Deceived by ourselves.
 - Wishful thinking.
 - Not listening carefully.
 - Talking when we should be listening.
 - Blind to our own condition.
 - False comparisons.
 - Thinking like a fool.
