The Authority Of The Bible

- "Our traditional approaches to scripture has likewise been challenged at the grass root level through a number of concerns, such as divorce, drugs, aids (sic), homosexuality, and women's roles ...
- "The intuition has been that older approaches to hermeneutics do not help in getting closer to God and each other, nor do they help us sort out puzzling questions in regard to family breakdowns, divorce, and women's roles. So in some manner interpretation of the scripture must be repositioned so as to provide more help." (Thomas Olbricht, <u>Hermeneutics: The Beginning Point</u>, Christian Scholars Conference 1989, Pepperdine University, pages 4,6.)

Inspired. 2 Timothy 3:16–17 The very words, selected by the Holy Spirit. 1 Corinthians 2:7–13; cf. 1 Thessalonians 2:13; 2 Peter 1:20–21

Reveal "**all** truth." John 16:13

"All things that pertain to life and godliness." 2 Peter 1:3 NOTE: Complete

All Sufficient. (Profitable) 2 Timothy 3:16-17 **"Doctrine, teaching" -**Doctrine of Christ. 2 John 9 Same as: Apostles' Doctrine Acts 2:42 Opposite of: Doctrines of men. Matthew 15:7-9

The Nature Of Scripture

<u>All Sufficient.</u> (Profitable) 2 Timothy 3:16-17

"*Reproof*" - convict, show to be wrong. Ephesians 5:11; 2 Timothy 4:2

- 2 Peter 2:1–2 Promotes destructive heresies– opposed truth.
- Romans 16:17 Cause division/stumbling <u>contrary</u>to doctrine learned.
- 1 Timothy 1:3,10–11 Another doctrine, <u>contrary</u>to sound doctrine.
- Galatians 1:6-9 <u>Contrary</u>doctrine prohibited (even though teacher is an angel or apostle - Galatians 2:11-14)

- cf. Titus 2:11-12 "deny" aparneomai to affirm that one has no connection with. cf. Matthew 26:34-35,75 (Strong)

<u>Authoritative</u>.

- The OT scriptures were bound as steadfast. Hebrews 2:2
- It was not to be altered. Joshua 1:6-8; Jeremiah 10:23





The Nature Of Scripture

Understandable. Ephesians 3:3ff; 5:17

- David had earlier called the word of God "a lamp to my feet and a light to my path" Psalms 119:105.
- "The entrance of your words gives light; it gives understanding to the simple." Psalms 119:130.

The Nature Of Scripture

<u>Understandable</u>. Ephesians 3:3ff; 5:17 *Genesis 1:27, "And God <u>created man</u> in his own image, in the image of God created he him; male and female created he them."*

Romans 1:16–17, "For I am not ashamed of the <u>gospel: for it is the power of God</u> unto salvation to every one that believeth; to the Jew first, and also to the Greek. For therein is revealed a righteousness of God from faith unto faith: as it is written, But the righteous shall live by faith."

The Nature Of Scripture

Determines fellowship.

- Fellowship with Christ. 1 John 1:3-4; 2:3-6; 2 John 9
- Fellowship with believers. John 17:20ff;
 1 Corinthians 5:1ff; 2 Corinthians 2:5-11

The Nature Of Scripture

Standard by which we will be judged. John 12:48; Matthew 10:40; Lk. 10:16

The Nature Of Scripture

Conclusion:

- What the apostles SPOKE they also WROTE.
 They taught the same thing in every church.
 1 Corinthians 4:17; 7:17.
- Why then is there division? cf. 1 Corinthians 1:10
- A desire to break free of Biblical restraints has cultivated the soil for redefining the nature of Scripture! cf. 2 Thessalonians 2:10
