Provide for your own

- 1 Timothy 5:1-8
- Do not sharply rebuke an older man, but rather appeal to him as a father, to the younger men as brothers, 2 the older women as mothers, and the younger women as sisters, in all purity. 3 Honor widows who are widows indeed; 4 but if any widow has children or grand-children, they must first learn to practice piety in regard to their own family and to make some return to their parents; for this is acceptable in the sight of God. 5 Now she who is a widow indeed and who has been left alone, has fixed her hope on God and continues in entreaties and prayers night and day. 6 But she who gives herself to wanton pleasure is dead even while she lives. 7 Prescribe these things as well, so that they may be above reproach. 8 But if anyone does not provide for his own, and especially for those of his household, he has denied the faith and is worse than an unbeliever.

- ¹Then some Pharisees and scribes came to Jesus from Jerusalem and said, ² "Why do Your disciples break the tradition of the elders? For they do not wash their hands when they eat bread." ² And He answered and said to them, "Why do you yourselves transgress the commandment of God for the sake of your tradition? ² "For God said, 'HONOR YOUR FATHER AND MOTHER,' and, 'HE WHO SPEAKS EVIL OF FATHER OR MOTHER ISTO BE PUTTO DEATH, ¹ "But you say, 'Whoever says to his father or mother, 'Whatever I have that would help you has been given to God," ² he is not to honor his father or his mother.' - Matthew 12:1-7

Which is more important, the gold or the temple that sanctified the gold? 12 "And," Whoever swears by the altar, that is nothing, but whoever swears by the offering on it, he is obligated." 12 "You blind men, which is more important, the offering, or the altar that sanctifies the offering? 22 "Therefore, whoever swears by the altar, swears both by the altar and by everything on it. 21 "And whoever swears by the temple, swears both by the temple and by Him who dwells within it. 22 "And whoever swears by heaven, swears both by the throne of God and by Him who sits upon it.

Contrast to Pharisees

- Mathew 23:16-28
- 23 "Woe to you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! For you tithe mint and dill and cummin, and have neglected the weightier provisions of the law: justice and mercy and faithfulness; but these are the things you should have done without neglecting the others. 24 "You blind guides, who strain out a gnat and swallow a camel! 25 "Woe to you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! For you clean the outside of the cup and of the dish, but inside they are full of robbery and selfindulgence. 26 "You blind Pharisee, first clean the inside of the cup and of the dish, so that the outside of it may become clean also. 27 "Woe to you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! For you are like whitewashed tombs which on the outside appear beautiful, but inside they are full of dead men's bones and all uncleanness. 28 "So you, too, outwardly appear, righteous to men, but inwardly you are full of hypocrisy and lawlessness.'

- 1 Corinthians 13
- e 1 If I speak with the tongues of men and of angels, but do not have love, I have become a noisy gong or a clanging cymbal. 2 If I have the gift of prophecy, and know all mysteries and all knowledge; and if I have all faith, so as to remove mountains, but do not have love, I am nothing. 3 And if I give all my possessions to feed the poor, and if I surrender my body to be burned, but do not have love, it profits me nothing. 4 Love is patient, love is kind and is not jealous; love does not brag and is not arrogant. 5 does not act unbecomingly; it does not seek its own, is not provoked, does not take into account a wrong suffered, 6 does not rejoice in unrighteousness, but rejoices with the truth; 2 bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. 8 Love never falls; but if there are gifts of prophecy, they will be done away; if there are tongues, they will cease; if there is knowledge, if will be done away. 2 For we know in part and we prophesy in part; 28 but when the perfect comes, the partial will be done away. 2 When I was a child, I used to speak like a child, think like a child, reason like a child; when I became of man, I did away with childight hings. 2 For now we see in a mirror dimly, but then face to face; now I know in part, but then I will know fullyjust as I also have been fully known. 2 But now faith, hope, love, abide these three; but the greatest of these is love.
