# The Mistakes Of Nabal

Nabal was selfish. 1 Sam. 25:10-11

Did not appreciate his good wife, Abigail. cf. Prov. 31

- 1 Sam. 25:3 "Good understanding" ... "Beautiful"
- 1 Sam. 25:18 Generous.
- 1 Sam. 25:26ff Knowledgeable.
- 1 Sam. 25:36ff Prudent to a Foolish husband.

## Don't Be A Fool Like Nabal...

Those who won't listen to advice. Prov. 1:7; 23:9; 1:22; 12:15; 28:26. (cf. 1 Kgs. 12:6-15)

#### Don't Be A Fool Like Nabal...

<u>Those who pay no attention to warnings.</u> Prov. 14:16; 22:3; 13:19; 10:23; 26:11

## Don't Be A Fool Like Nabal...

#### Those who believe everything they hear.

- > The wise investigate; fools don't (Prov. 14:15).
- Some believe everything they hear in religion, but they are wrong in doing so. (cf.. Mt. 7:15; 1 Jno. 4:1)
- > The attitude of a wise man is demonstrated by the people of Berea (Acts. 17:11)
- > Wise men "prove all things." (1 Thess. 5:21)

## Don't Be A Fool Like Nabal...

- > <u>Those who mock at sin</u>. Prov. 14:9
- The fool sins without remorse or blushing. (Jer. 8:12; 6:15)
  - Sin is a serious thing. It is rebellion against God and it separates one from God. (Isa. 59:1-2) Yet many treat it lightly.
  - = Such cannot escape the wrath of God. (Gal. 6:7-8)

## Don't Be A Fool Like Nabal...

- <u>Those who are contentious and get mad easily.</u> Prov. 18:6; 14:7; 27:3; Eccl. 7:9
  - A wise man is slow to wrath. (Jms. 1:18-21)

## Don't Be A Fool Like Nabal...

<u>Those who talk too much.</u> Eccl. 10:14; 10:12; 5:2,3; Prov. 10:19; 18:7

- > Our words can produce either good or evil, depending upon the heart from which they proceed. (Mt. 12:35-37)
- We must be careful how we use our tongue. (Jms. 3:5ff)

### Don't Be A Fool Like Nabal...

Those who are deceived by strong drink. Prov. 20:1; 23:29-32; Gal. 5:19ff; cf. 1 Pet. 4:3

### Don't Be A Fool Like Nabal...

Those who are deceived by strong drink. cf. 1 Pet. 4:3 "Winebibbings"

- >An overflow (or surplus) of wine, i.e. vinolency (drunkenness): (Strong);
- > "Drunkenness," implying the consumption of a large quantity of wine. (Greek-English Lexicon...)
- ➤ "Debauchery since it is an extravagant indulgence in long, drawn-out drinking bouts which may induce permanent damage to the body." (The Complete Word Study Dictionary)

# Don't Be A Fool Like Nabal...

#### <u>Those who are deceived by strong drink</u>. cf. 1 Pet. 4:3 "Revellings"

- Drinking parties involving unrestrained indulgence in alcoholic beverages and accompanying immoral behavior. (Greek-English Lexicon) NT:2970

## Don't Be A Fool Like Nabal...

Those who are deceived by strong drink. cf. 1 Pet. 4:3

#### "Carousings"

Gk. word "potos" which is translated "<u>drinking parties</u>" (NASB) in 1 Peter 4:3 means "the opportunity of drinking, the banquet, <u>not necessarily excessive drinking</u> but giving opportunity for excess...it marks a step in advance of drunkenness, and is clearly condemned in that passage ..." (Zodhiates Lexical Aids To The New Testament)

## Don't Be A Fool Like Nabal...

Those who say in their hearts that there is no God. Ps. 14:1

> The Gentile world before Christ demonstrated this truth. Rom. 1:18-28; Ps. 115:4-8; Isa. 44:9-20

# Don't Be A Fool Like Nabal...

Those who will not obey. Mt. 7:21-27 Jesus divides humanity into two classes: Wise and Foolish. (cf. 2 Thess. 1:7ff; Rom. 2:8-9)

### You Have A Choice... Don't Be A Fool Like Nabal !

- If YOU would gain the favor of God, <u>HE</u> must be first in your life – <u>NOT SELF</u>! (Mt. 16:24)
- The Bible teaches that those who fail to make adequate preparation, who lay up treasures for themselves, but are not rich toward God, are fools. (Mt. 25:1-13; Lk. 12:16-21)
- May the mistakes of Nabal serve as a warning for us!
