David's Problems

"Hear my cry, O God; attend unto my prayer. From the end of the earth will I call unto thee, when my heart is overwhelmed"

David's Method of Handling Problems

- He prayed to God. "Hear my cry, O God; attend unto my prayer" verse 1. (cf. Hebrews 5:7; James 1:2-4).
- <u>David expected help from God</u>. "For thou hast been a refuge (shelter NKJV) for me, a strong tower from the enemy" verse 3 (1 Samuel 17:34; 1 Samuel 18ff; 1 Samuel 21:10)
 - Daniel. Daniel 6
 - Shadrach, Meshach, and Abed-nego. Daniel 3:19ff
 - Hezekiah. 2 Kings 18-19
 - Jonah. Jonah 2:10
 - Peter. Acts 12
 - Sometimes, however, God does not deliver us from our problems. 2 Corinthians 12:9–10

David's Concept of God

- "The **rock** that is higher than I." Verse 3
- For thou hast been a **shelter** for me,
- "and a **strong tower** from the enemy." Verse 3 KJV

David's Trust In God

"I will trust in the shelter of Your wings." Verse 4 NKJV

- David Trusted God in Peace. 1 Samuel 17:34;
- David Trusted God in Troubles. 1 Samuel 18ff; 1 Samuel 21:10
