Innovations Of Man

- God has consistently rejected the innovations of man in worship to Him
 - I Corinthians 10:5, 11 – *“God was not well pleased ... written for our admonition”*

Innovations Of Man

- God has consistently rejected the innovations of man in worship to Him
 - Genesis 4:3-7 – *“sin coucheth at the door”*
 - Leviticus 10:1-2 – *“which he had not commanded them”*

Innovations Of Man

- God has consistently rejected the innovations of man in worship to Him
 - Malachi 1:8 – *“will he be pleased with thee”*

Innovations Of Man

- Were these people sincere in their attempts to worship God?
 - Yes – They were
- God still rejected them and their offerings

The Casual Attitude

- We live in an increasingly casual society
 - This is reflected in the types of worship we have just studied
- The Lord’s church is not about how casual we can be.

The Casual Attitude

- We are in the presence of God
 - Psalms 89:7 – *“greatly to be feared”*
 - The throne scene in Revelation chapters 4 and 5 was not a party
 - Malachi 1:6 – *“where is mine honor”*

The Casual Attitude

- This is a solemn occasion
 - I Corinthians 11:26 – “*ye proclaim the Lord’s death*”
 - I Peter 4:11 – “*oracles of God*”
 - Our prayers are petitions to our Creator and Judge

The Casual Attitude

- We are not here to relax and have fun with friends
 - I Corinthians 11:17 – “*for the worse*”

The Casual Attitude

- The Lord’s Supper can be likened to both a funeral and a wedding ceremony
 - “*proclaim the Lord’s death*”
 - Ephesians 5:31-32 – “*I speak in regard of Christ and of the church.*”

The Casual Attitude

- Casualness and “ME” centered worship is manifested outwardly
 - Outward attitude
 - *Bored*
 - *Disinterested*
 - *Unprepared*
 - *Continually late*
 - *Disruptive*

The Casual Attitude

- The clothes we wear
 - “*Dress for success*”
 - “*The clothes make the man*”
 - “God looks on the heart”
 - Hebrews 4:12 – “*intents of the heart*”
 - Exodus 29:29-30 – “*the holy garments*”

The Casual Attitude

- The clothes we wear
 - Matthew 22:11-12 – “*had not on a wedding-garment*”
 - We cannot look on the heart but we do display the thoughts of our hearts
 - Matthew 15:18-20 – “*out of the heart*”
 - Why do we dress up for work and dress down for worship?

“What Must I Do To Be Saved?”

- Hear the Word of God
 - Romans 10:8 – *“But what saith it? The word is nigh thee, in thy mouth, and in thy heart: that is, the word of faith, which we preach”*
- Believe in that Word
 - Romans 10:11 – *“For the scripture saith, Whosoever believeth on him shall not be put to shame.”*

“What Must I Do To Be Saved?”

- Repent of your sins
 - Acts 3:19 – *“Repent ye therefore, and turn again, that your sins may be blotted out, that so there may come seasons of refreshing from the presence of the Lord”*
- Confess that Jesus is the Son of God
 - I John 4:15 – *“Whosoever shall confess that Jesus is the Son of God, God abideth in him, and he in God.”*

“What Must I Do To Be Saved?”

- Be immersed in water (baptized)
 - Acts 2:38 – *“And Peter (said) unto them, Repent ye, and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ unto the remission of your sins; and ye shall receive the gift of the Holy Spirit.”*
