

AM I DOING MY PART?




After a 70 year absence, wolves were reintroduced into Yellowstone National Park in 1995

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
Wolves made things much better for plants and animals


- Overgrazing by deer and elk decreased
- · Aspen, willow, and cottonwood trees again grew
- Beaver returned to make ponds which helped otter, duck, muskrat, fish, reptiles, and amphibians
- Trees remarkably grew at 5 times the rate they had grown previously
- Erosion along streams and lakes decreased
- · Migratory song birds numbers increased dramatically
- · Fish and aquatic animals grew in numbers
- Less coyotes (because of wolves) meant more rabbits and mice (food) for hawks, fox, weasels, and badgers
- Ravens and eagles fed on carrion left by the wolves
- More plants and shrubs produced berries which helped to have more bears

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


- There was less erosion.
- More pools formed and more riffle sections, which were great for wildlife and fish habitats
- The regenerating forests stabilized the river banks so that they collapsed less often, so rivers became more fixed in their course
- By driving the deer out (for decades Yellowstone was overgrazed) of some places and the vegetation recovering on the valley sides, there was less soil erosion, because the vegetation stabilized
- Wolves, small in number, transformed the ecosystem and physical geography of the 2,219,791 acre Yellowstone National Park!










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It starts with <u>me</u> knowing what God wants <u>me</u> to do to be pleasing to him.

John 14:15 (NKJV): "If <u>you</u> love Me, keep My commandments."

2 Timothy 2:15 (NKJV): "Be diligent [Study (KJV)] to present <u>yourself</u> approved to God, a worker who does not need to be ashamed, rightly dividing [handling (ESV)] the word of truth."

2 Timothy 3:16-17 (NKJV): "All Scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction [training (ESV)] in righteousness, that the man of God may be complete, thoroughly equipped for every good work."



• Now we want to look at scriptures that remind us of what Christians should be doing.



Mark 12:29-31 (NKJV): "Jesus answered him, 'The first of all the commandments is: "Hear, O Israel, the LORD our God, the LORD is one. And <u>you</u> shall love the LORD your God with all <u>your heart</u>, with all <u>your soul</u>, with all <u>your mind</u>, and with all <u>your strength</u>." This is the first commandment. And the second, like it, is this: "You shall love <u>your neighbor</u> as yourself." There is no other commandment greater than these.""



Matthew 7:12 (NKJV): "Therefore, whatever <u>you</u> want men to do to <u>you</u>, do also to them, for this is the Law and the Prophets."

Matthew 7:24 (NKJV): "Therefore whoever <u>hears</u> these sayings of Mine, and <u>does them</u>, I will liken him to a wise man who built his house on the rock"

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Romans 12:1-2 (NKJV): "I beseech <u>you</u> therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that <u>you</u> present <u>your bodies</u> a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable to God, which is <u>your reasonable service</u>. And do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of <u>your mind</u>, that <u>you</u> may prove what is that good and acceptable and perfect will of God."

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Romans 12:4-8 (NKJV): "For as we have many members in one body, but all the members do not have the same function, so we, being many, are one body in Christ, and <u>individually members of one</u> <u>another</u>. Having then gifts differing according to the grace that is given <u>to us</u>, <u>let us use them</u>: if prophecy, <u>let us</u> prophesy in proportion to <u>our faith</u>; or ministry, <u>let us</u> use it in our ministering; <u>he who</u> <u>teaches</u>, in teaching; he who exhorts, in exhortation; <u>he who gives</u>, with liberality; he who leads, with diligence; he who shows mercy, with cheerfulness."

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Romans 12:9-21 (NKJV): "Let love be without hypocrisy. Abhor what is evil. Cling to what is good. Be kindly affectionate to one another with brotherly love, in honor giving preference to one another; not lagging in diligence, fervent in spirit, serving the Lord; rejoicing in hope, patient in tribulation, continuing steadfastly in prayer; distributing to the needs of the saints, given to hospitality. Bless those who persecute you; bless and do not curse. Rejoice with those who rejoice, and weep with those who weep. Be of the same mind toward one another. Do not set your mind on high things, but associate with the humble. Do not be wise in your own opinion. Repay no one evil for evil. Have regard for good things in the sight of all men. If it is possible, as much as depends on you, live peaceably with all men. Beloved, do not avenge yourselves, but rather give place to wrath; for it is written, 'Vengeance is Mine, I will repay,' says the Lord. Therefore 'If your enemy is hungry, feed him; If he is thirsty, give him a drink; For in so doing you will heap coals of fire on his head.' Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good.'



1 Corinthians 16:2 (NKJV): "On the first day of the week <u>let each one of you lay something aside</u>, storing up as he may prosper, that there be no collections when I come."

2 Corinthians 9:6-7 (NKJV): "But this I say: He who sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and he who sows bountifully will also reap bountifully. So let <u>each one give</u> <u>as he purposes in his heart</u>, not grudgingly or of necessity; for God loves a cheerful giver."

Galatians 6:1-10 (NKJV): "Brethren, if a man is overtaken in any trespass, you who are spiritual restore such a one in a spirit of gentleness, considering yourself lest you also be tempted. Bear one another's burdens, and so fulfill the law of Christ. For if anyone thinks himself to be something, when he is nothing, he deceives himself. But let each one examine his own work, and then he will have rejoicing in himself alone, and not in another. For each one shall bear his own load. Let him who is taught the word share in all good things with him who teaches. Do not be deceived, God is not mocked; for whatever a man sows, that he will also reap. For he who sows to his flesh will of the flesh reap corruption, but he who sows to the Spirit will of the Spirit reap everlasting life. And let us not grow weary while doing good, for in due season we shall reap if we do not lose heart. Therefore, as we have opportunity, let us do good to all, especially to those who are of the household of faith."



Ephesians 4:15-16 (NKJV): "but, speaking the truth in love, may grow up in all things into Him who is the head – Christ – from whom the whole body, joined and knit together by what <u>every joint supplies</u>, according to the effective working by which <u>every</u> <u>part does its share</u>, causes growth of the body for the <u>edifying of itself in love</u>."

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
Colossians 3:18-24 (NKJV): "Wives, submit to <u>your own</u> <u>husbands</u>, as is fitting in the Lord. Husbands, love <u>your</u> <u>wives</u> and do not be bitter toward them. Children, <u>obey</u> <u>your parents</u> in all things, for this is well pleasing to the Lord. Fathers, <u>do not provoke your children</u>, lest they become discouraged. Bondservants, obey in all things <u>your masters</u> according to the flesh, not with eye service, as men-pleasers, but in sincerity of heart, fearing God. And whatever you do, <u>do it heartily</u>, as to the Lord and not <u>to men</u>, knowing that from the Lord <u>you</u> will receive the reward of the inheritance; <u>for you serve the Lord Christ</u>."

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Colossians 4:5-6 (NKJV): "Walk in wisdom toward those who are outside, redeeming the time. Let <u>your</u> <u>speech</u> always be with grace, seasoned with salt, that <u>you</u> may know how <u>you</u> ought to answer <u>each</u> <u>one</u>."

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1 Peter 3:15-17 (NKJV): "But sanctify the Lord God in <u>your hearts</u>, and always *be* ready to *give* a defense to everyone who asks <u>you</u> a reason for the hope that is in <u>you</u>, with meekness and fear; having a good conscience, that when they defame <u>you</u> as evildoers, those who revile your good conduct in Christ may be ashamed. For *it is* better, if it is the will of God, to suffer for doing good than for doing evil."



1 Peter 4:7-11 (NKJV): "But the end of all things is at hand; therefore be serious and watchful in your prayers. And above all things have fervent love for one another, for 'love will cover a multitude of sins.' Be hospitable to one another without grumbling. As each one has received a gift, minister it to one another, as good stewards of the manifold grace of God. If anyone speaks, let him speak as the oracles of God. If anyone ministers, let him do it as with the ability which God supplies, that in all things God may be glorified through Jesus Christ, to whom belong the glory and the dominion forever and ever. Amen."

- Notice our last passage in Matthew 28:18-20.

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Matthew 28:18-20 (NKJV): "And Jesus came and spoke to them, saying, 'All authority has been given to Me in heaven and on earth. <u>Go therefore and make</u> <u>disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the</u> <u>name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy</u> <u>Spirit, teaching them to observe all things that I have</u> <u>commanded you; and Io, I am with you always</u>, even to the end of the age.' Amen."
