By What Authority? Acts 4:1-12

I can be my own boss

- There is an appeal to not have to answer to anyone
- This can be a slippery slope leading to destruction
 - We see this in the time of the Judges
 - Judges 21:25 "everyone did what was right in his own eyes"
 - Their behavior went from bad to worse wretched
 - It remains popular with young adults ... rebel against limits

Those in power have different ideas

- People in power tend to want to hold onto it
- The Jewish rulers demanded to know the authority of the apostles to teach their doctrine
 - Acts 4:5-7 "By what power or by what name have you done this?"
- What were they asking?
 - Power (definition) "dunamei force, strength, power ... ultimately, authority"
 - Authority (definition) "exousia authority, right, power"

Those in power have different ideas

- What were they asking?
 - By what power ...
 - Apostles' power could not have originated in men
 - Jesus demonstrated power that could only originate with God
 - Acts 2:22 "attested by God to you ...
 - It meant God was backing Jesus
 - John 3:2 "... unless God is with him ..."

- What were they asking?
 - By what power ...
 - Jesus had promised His apostles power
 - Acts 1:8 "... you shall receive power ..."
 - They preached with power
 - •I Corinthians 2:1-5 "in the power of God
 - The Jewish leaders were asking who is the authority behind the miracles they were doing

Those in power have different ideas

- What were they asking?
 - By what power
 - By what name
 - What authority was backing their teaching
 - Jesus stated that He came with the authority of His Father
 - John 5:31-47 "... in My Father's name"
 - •Some claim authority in themselves
 - Not a single miracle to back them up

- What were they asking?
 - By what power
 - By what name
 - Jesus promised the disciples they would act with His delegated authority
 - •Mark 16:17 "these signs will follow those"
 - •The apostles were to appeal to His authority
 - John 14:11-14 "If you ask anything My name"
 - •The Jewish leaders asked who gave them the right to teach these things

Those in power have different ideas

- What were they asking?
 - By what power
 - By what name
 - The answer was "Jesus"
 - Acts 4:10 "by the name of Jesus Christ"
 - The apostles were acting as Jesus had authorized
 - Simon the sorcerer meets Peter/John
 - Acts 8:17-19 "he offered them money
 - Authority: "exousia authority, right, sower"
 - Authority is not bought, it is grante@
 - Acts 8:20-23 "... the gift of God ..."

The need for authority

• Rest Stop

- Principles of authority replaced with emotional, irrational desires to do as one pleases
 - Selfishness, pride, evil desires
- Salvation can only be gained through the one authorized to give it
 - Acts 4:12 "there is no other name ..."
 - There is no authority other than Jesus
 - Jesus inherited a more excellent authority
 Hebrews 1:4-6 "a more excellent frame"
 - Jesus has the highest authority
 - •Philippians 2:9-11 "above every name"

The need for authority

- God teaches the need for His authority in every aspect of our lives ... via Jesus Christ
 - Colossians 3:17 "do all in the name ..."
 - Jesus was given all authority
 - Matthew 28:18 "All authority has been given to me ..."
 - Jesus' authority is above all others
 - Ephesians 1:19-23 "head over all things
 - Our conduct must have His prior approval

Examples of recognizing authority

- Moses spoke to Pharaoh in God's name
 - Exodus 5:23 "... speak in Your name"
 - Moses spoke only God's words
- Nadab and Abihu offered "profane fire"
 - Leviticus 10:1-2 "He had not commanded"
 - Their actions did not honor God
 - Leviticus 10:3 "I must be regarded as #6

Examples of recognizing authority

- Uzzah was struck dead for trying to steady the ark
 - Il Samuel 6:6 "Uzzah put out his hand ..."
 - He was struck down for his irreverence
 - Il Samuel 6:7 "God struck him there ..."
 - They had not followed God's orders
 - I Chronicles 15:13 "because we did not consult Him ..."
 - They had not carried the ark per God's instructions
 - By doing it their own way, they showed no respect for God ... followed man's authority (King David)

Examples of recognizing authority

- A centurion's comment on the need for authority
 - Matthew 8:5-9 "But only speak a word"
- The Jewish leaders questioned Jesus' authority
 - Matthew 21:23 "who gave You this authority"
 - Jesus answered that there were only two options
 - •God or man

Everything we do must come from God

- When we speak, speak as the oracles of God
 - I Peter 4:11 "that in all things God may be glorified ..."
- We are not to think beyond what is written
 - I Corinthians 4:6 "that none of you may be puffed up ..."
 - Galatians 1:8-9 "preach any other gospel"
- We are to examine everything carefully
 - I Thessalonians 5:21-22 "Test all things"
 - Including those things stated in the pulpit

Everything we do must come from God

- Churches have introduced unscriptural practices
 - Excuses:
 - It meets our needs
 - It gets more people involved
 - It brings in a lot of people
 - It generates enthusiasm
 - It allows us to get things done
 - We really like it
 - It keeps our young people's interest
 - It creates a warm, accepting environment
 - These are not necessarily bad
 - But we must have Book, Chapter, and Verse

Everything we do must come from God

- We must do what is right
 - Acts 10:35 "fears Him and works righteousness"
- We cannot cross the boundary of what's allowed
- II John 9 "... does not have God"
- There is only one way
 - John 14:6 "No one comes to the Father except through Me"
- There is no other authority
 - Acts 4:12 "... there is no other name under heaven ..."
