



Revelation 12

The Woman Persecuted

- · Satan knows he must fight on earth.
- This antagonism originated with Satan's hatred for Christ!
- He turns his attention to the children of his conqueror!
- Primary application to Revelation is the Roman persecution, the beast's great persecution of the church.
- Yet, to this day Satan persecutes God's children by encouraging them to abandon their faith!

Revelation 12

Flight of the Woman

- Where she is nourished for a time, and times, and half a time, from the face of the serpent. Three and a half years is equivalent to 1,260 days (verse 6) and forty-two months occurring elsewhere in the book.
 - The two witnesses shall prophesy 1,260 days (11:3).
 - The holy city shall be trodden under foot forty-two months (11:2; 13:5)
 - The woman is nourished for a time, times, and half a time (12:6, 14)
- The fourth kingdom would war against the saints for a "time, times, and the dividing of time" (Daniel 7:25). The fulfillment of Daniel's prophecy is revealed to John. The recipients are under severe persecution from the Roman Empire.
- The promise being assured throughout Revelation is that God will nourish His people through the time of testing.


Flight of the Woman


- God told the people of Israel that He carried them on eagles' wings. (Exodus 19:4)
- He delivered them by His power. (Deuteronomy 32:11; Psalm 36:7; Isaiah 40:31)
- · He gives "similar refuge" to the church.
- "The woman flew into the wilderness to her place."
 God's people flee; under intense hardship and persecution.
- There, she will be nourished.



Flight of the Woman

- The woman now represents those who stand for and with God. (Spiritual Israel)
- She will be protected by God.
- She will be able to resist evil and the devil's scheme. (James 4:7-8; 1 Peter 5:8-9)
- She may suffer physical persecution, but will ultimately be victorious. (Romans 8:35-39)


The Dragon's Attempt

- Though Satan ejected from his mouth a stream of water, as a flood to destroy her, the earth swallowed up the current and rescued the woman!
- At one time, God used water to destroy evil. (1 Peter 3:20-21)
- In the Old Testament, a flood signified tribulation from ungodly men who were overwhelming God's people (Isaiah 8:5-8; Psalms 18:4).
- God is able to dry up rivers so that He might protect His faithful (Isaiah 42:15; 43:2; Psalm 144:7).
- The flood sent forth by the serpent points to his effort to drown the church
 in a torrent of Roman persecution. Satan's "flood" is the use of ungodly
 men and methods. (Psalm 124:4, 58; 57:19-20; Ephesians 4:14)

Revelation 12

Attempt Thwarted by God

- God caused the earth to help the woman.
- The world absorbs/drinks up the flood sent by Satan. Mankind falls for and follows after Satan's lies
- The earth came to the woman's rescue by distracting Rome's attention – political uprisings, local wars, and other conflicts.
- **Divine providence** protected and sustained the woman and her offspring!



Revelation 12

Rest of Her "Offspring"

Revelation 12:17 - "the remnant of her seed." KJV

- Following the persecution depicted in Revelation, the woman now represents the faithful children of God in the church.
- Satan will attack her children because God loves them
- He attacks them one by one, but to no avail.
- God's armor protects them Ephesians 6:10-18.

Revelation 12

Summary...

Key to this chapter - Genesis 3:15

- Word to remember "victory"
- Satan defeated in heaven
- Satan limited to final defeat on earth
 - Verses 1-6: struggle between the seed (woman and dragon) God's people protected
 - Verses 7-12: Christ's birth, atonement, and ascension and its effects. Satan cannot destroy the woman or her offspring!
 - Verses 13-17: persecution of the woman God's divine protection!

Revelation 12

Summary...

- Those who trust the Lamb will be victorious, although many will forfeit their physical lives. Matthew 16:25
- The faithful are those who look "not at the things which are seen, but at the things which are not seen." 2 Corinthians 4:18; cf. Colossians 3:1-3
- The Christ has been lifted up. The Accuser has been cast down. The victory belongs to God!



The Battle: Forces of the Conflict Satan's Agents – The Two Beasts

Revelation 13

Revelation 13:1

"and he stood upon the sand of the sea. And I saw a <u>beast coming up out of the sea</u>, having ten horns, and seven heads, and on his horns ten diadems, and upon his heads names of blasphemy."

Revelation 13

Satan and His Evil Forces

- Beast out of the sea political power from the mass of humanity.
 - "Sea" cf. Revelation 8:8; 10:2, 8; 12:12; 13:1; 20:13; 21:1
- Its origin and appearance indescribable horror
 - "He stood on the sand," dragon awaiting his henchmen (cf. Translations: "He stood ..." "I stood ...")
 - "Coming up out of the sea," the sea of humanity (Isaiah 17:12) Note similar characteristics of the dragon (12:3)
 - Having: Ten horns (great power); complete strength, which was given by Satan!

Revelation 13

Satan and His Evil Forces

- Beast out of the sea political power
- Its origin and **appearance** *indescribable horror*
 - "Seven heads," perfect authority as it was given to him by Satan
 - "Ten diadems" on his horns. (Satan has them on his head
 - 12:3) Satan is the true power behind the beast's royalty.
 - In either case, the crowns (diademata) portray the idea of royalty and great authority. Not the victory crown (stéphanos).
 - "Blasphemous names" on his heads instead of crowns; to blaspheme God and His saints. (cf. Daniel 7:7-8, 11, 17-27, esp. verse 25).
