Jesus and the Woman Taken In Adultery

8:9-11 They all left, beginning with the eldest.

- KJV and NKJV "being convicted by their own conscience" not in the
- "Beginning with the older ones ..." either referring to age or rank.
 NOTE: When Jesus said, "Neither do I condemn thee ... Jesus was not implying what the woman had done was right.
- Yet. He could not command that she be stoned without witnesses. (Deuteronomy 17:7)
- Secondly, He stood prepared to forgive her if she was willing to repent. (cf. Matthew 9:13; 1 Timothy 2:4; 2 Peter 3:9)
- As Lord, He is willing to forgive all sin.
- He often forgave sinners while on earth. (cf. Luke 7:47; Matthew 9:2)
- Yet, forgiveness is conditioned upon repentance and obedience. (cf. Luke 13:3; Acts 2:38; 22:16; 1 Corinthians 6:9-11)

Jesus and the Woman Taken in Adultery

John 8:1-11

8:9-11 They all left, beginning with the eldest.

- Those who continue to sin will reap eternal condemnation (cf. Galatians 5:19-21; Colossians 3:5-14; Revelation 21:8)
- "I do not condemn you." (John 3:17; 12:47-48)
 - "Condemn" katakrinoo to give judgment against, to judge worthy of punishment, (Thayer) ... worthy to die as punishment.
 - Howbeit, this leaves out one important consideration: Jesus had not come into the world to judge and condemn (John 3:17; 8:15), but to seek and to save the lost (Luke 19:10).
- · Did this mean Jesus approved of her actions?
- Jesus told her to "go and sin no more." NOTE: Jesus called what she did "sin."

Jesus and the Woman Taken In Adultery

John 8:1-11

NOTE: What Jesus did NOT say:

- · Your sins are forgiven.
- You are saved.
- >Jesus did instruct her to stop sinning! (John 5:14; 1 Corinthians 15:34; 1 John 2:1-2)
- ➤ "No more ..." (2 Corinthians 5:15; Galatians 2:20; Ephesians 4:17; 1 Peter 4:2)
- >Though not condemned to death, judgment is coming! (John 12:47-48;
 - cf. Deuteronomy 18:19; John 8:26)

Jesus Teaches At The Feast "I am the light of the world"

John 8:12-30

"I Am the light of the world"

John 8:12-30

John 8:12, "Again therefore Jesus spake unto them, saying, I am the light of the world: he that followeth me shall not walk in the darkness. but shall have the light of life."

- In this chapter Jesus makes a very bold claim.
 - He claims to be the light of the world.
 - The Jews continue to resent his claims and their prejudice becomes apparent.

The Jews desire to kill him because he said,

"I Am the light of the world"

John 8:12-30

Jesus makes seven bold claims ("I AM") in the gospel of John. Jesus said "I AM" ...

- 1. The bread of life. John 6:35
- 2. The light of the world. John 8:12
- 3. The door. John 10:7
- 4. The good shepherd. John 10:11
- 5. The resurrection. John 11:25
- 6. The way, the truth, and the life. John 14:6
- 7. The true vine. John 15:1

"I Am the light of the world"

John 8:12-30

8:12 – Truth is represented in the Bible as being "light" because it **proclaims knowledge** to the ignorant and **exposes evil** which is represented as "darkness." (cf. John 3:19-21)

- Note the emphasis in John's writing on "truth," "light," and "darkness."
- The gospel. (John 1:1-4; 3:19-20; 12:35-36)
- Especially in the epistles of:
 - 1 John 1:5-9; 2:4,8-11; 3:18-19; 4:6; 5:7;
 - 2 John 1,3,4;
 - 3 John 1,3,4,8,12.

"I Am the light of the world"

John 8:12-30

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The use of "light" in:

Prophecy: (Isaiah 9:2; Matthew 4:16; Luke 1:78-79);
 Psalms 119:105, "Thy word is a lamp unto my feet, and light unto my path."

Psalms 119:130, "The opening of thy words giveth light; it giveth understanding unto the simple."

• The epistles: (2 Corinthians 4:1-6; 2 Peter 1:19)

"I Am the light of the world"

John 8:12-30

Jesus came that we might become lights through Him!

- Matthew 5:14, "You are the light of the world."
- Ephesians 5:7-8, "... walk as children of light."
- Philippians 2:15, "... you appear as lights in the world."

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
