

## Contention Over The Man Born Blind John 9:1-41

HOW WAS THE BLIND MAN MADE TO SEE? John 9:6-12

- 9:10-12 The purpose of this miracle had been served.
  This was a sign that effectively convinced the neighbors that Jesus had supernatural powers. (cf. Acts 2:22; John 2:11; John 3:1-2; John 20:30-31)
- The neighbors ask, "Where is he?"

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John  $9{:}13{\cdot}41$  – In this portion of the text , the Jews condemn Jesus because he has healed a man born blind.

- · Brought him to the Pharisees.
  - They were considered by the populace to be the authorities in matters of legal observance and religious orthodoxy (cf. John 7:47-48).
- The Jews try to intimidate the man who was healed.

# Contention Over The Man Born Blind John 9:1-41

A DIVISION BEGINS TO ARISE ABOUT HOW A SINNER CAN DO SUCH MIRACLES. John 9:13-34

9:13-16 - This healing was on the sabbath.

The Pharisees continue to condemn Jesus because the healing was <u>done on the Sabbath</u> implying that he had broken the law of Moses.

- This is only one of seven instances where Christ affected cures on the Sabbath day (Matthew 12:9; Mark 1:21, 29; Luke 13:14; 14:1; John 5:10).
- "The making of clay with spittle was clearly an infringement of the Pharisee's Sabbath regulations as related in the Mishnah (*Shabbath 14*), though totally in harmony with the spirit and letter of the law given by Moses." (Daniel King, *John*, Truth Commentaries, Page 246)

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A DIVISION BEGINS TO ARISE ABOUT HOW A SINNER CAN DO SUCH MIRACLES. John 9:13-34

9:13-16 – These Jews are so prejudiced that they cannot see anything good about what Jesus did. (cf. John 5:16-18; cf. John 7:21-24)

- Their efforts are not unlike their previous efforts to reject Jesus and His miracles.
- It is incredible that the Jews, in spite of this miracle, seek some excuse by which to justify their own rejection of Jesus.
- "Among the thirty-nine works forbidden to Jews on the Sabbath (Mishnah Shabbath 7:2) was kneading, and Jesus had kneaded the clay with his spittle to make the mud." (Daniel King, John, Truth Commentaries, Page 246)

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 $9{:}17{-}18$  – The Jews did not believe that this man had been born blind.

- The purpose of this is to disprove the miracle that Jesus has done.
- Another question is if Jesus was a sinner how could He do the works that He did.
- The blind man affirms that Jesus was a prophet.

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9:19-23 – The parents testify that this was their son and that he was born blind.

- The parents are not willing to affirm how their son can now see.
- We see their reluctance to affirm that Jesus is from God.
- They were afraid that the Jews would cast them out of the synagogue if they confessed that Jesus is the Christ.

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9:19-23 - To be cast out of the synagogue was a very severe excommunication. It involved separation from all social ties as well as religious.
cf. John 12:42-43 - This threat intimidated even the rulers themselves.
"The practice of excommunication among the Jews comes from very early times ('separated from the assembly,' Ezra 10:8).
"The Mishnah attests to two different forms:

(1) A temporary exclusion lasting thirty days; and,
(2) A permanent ban, or *herem*. Later Jewish law included also a minor ban of about a week's duration." (Daniel King, John, Truth Commentaries, Page 249)

This illustrates that the doctrine of faith only is not true. Here are some believers who are saved should have the courage of their convictions.

(cf. Luke 6:22; John 16:2)Are you intimidated by what others think?

### Contention Over The Man Born Blind John 9:1-41

 $9{:}24{-}34$  – These rulers question this young man trying to get him to reject Jesus.

9:24-27, "We know that this man is a sinner."

Their reasoning:

- (1) The Law forbade work on the Sabbath;
- (2) Jesus had healed on the Sabbath;
- (3) Therefore, Jesus was a sinner.

## Contention Over The Man Born Blind John 9:1-41

9:24-34 – THESE RULERS QUESTION THIS YOUNG MAN TRYING TO GET HIM TO REJECT JESUS.

- 9:24-27, "We know that this man is a sinner."
- This man's reasoning:
- He simply affirms what he knows. "I know, that, whereas I was blind, now I see."
- Rulers continue to press: "How opened he thine eyes?"
- The young man tells them, "I told you even now, and ye did not hear; wherefore would ye hear it again? would ye also become his disciples?" (cf. John 10:24-25) "Tell us plainly ..."

cf. 8:25-28, "They said therefore unto him, Who art thou? Jesus said unto them, Even that which I have also spoken unto you from the beginning."

### "I Am the light of the world" John 8:12-30

**8:25-28**, "They said therefore unto him, Who art thou? Jesus said unto them, Even that which I have also spoken unto you from the beginning."

# Jesus had repeatedly told them He was the Christ, the Son of God!

- The Samaritan woman said to Jesus, "I know that Messiah cometh (he that is called Christ): when he is come, he will declare unto us all things." Then Jesus said to her, "I that speak unto thee am (he)" (John 4:25-26).
- After healing a man who had been lame for thirty-eight years, Jesus claimed, *"My Father worketh even until now, and I work"* (John 5:17). The Jews understood His claim and *"sought the more to kill him"* (John 5:18).

### **"I Am the light of the world"** John 8:12-30

 $\ensuremath{8:25\text{-28}}\xspace -$  Jesus had repeatedly told them He was the Christ, the Son of God.

- Jesus claimed that He was not of this world and then said, "for except ye believe that I am (he), ye shall die in your sins" (John 8:23-24).
- In that same discourse, "Jesus said unto them, Verily, verily, I say unto you, Before Abraham was born, I am." Once again, "They took up stones therefore to cast at him ..." (John 8:58-59).

### **"I Am the light of the world"** John 8:12-30

# 8:25-28 – Jesus had repeatedly told them He was the Christ, the Son of God.

- John 10:24-25, "The Jews therefore came round about him, and said unto him, How long dost thou hold us in suspense? If thou art the Christ, tell us plainly. Jesus answered them, I told you, and ye believe not: the works that I do in my Father's name, these bear witness of me."
- John 10:30-31 Jesus claimed, "I and the Father are one" and, "The Jews took up stones again to stone him"
- In John 10:36, Jesus said, "I am the son of God."

# "I Am the light of the world"

John 8:12-30

# 8:25-28 – Jesus had repeatedly told them He was the Christ, the Son of God.

- He later said, "If ye had known me, ye would have known my Father also: from henceforth ye know him, and have seen him. Philip saith unto him, Lord, show us the Father, and it sufficeth us. Jesus saith unto him, Have I been so long time with you, and dost thou not know me, Philip? he that hath seen me hath seen the Father; how sayest thou, Show us the Father?" (John 14:7-9).
- John 8:27, "They perceived not that he spake to them of the Father."

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- 9:28-29 They "reviled him ... "
- "to speak in a highly insulting manner 'to slander, to insult strongly, slander'" (Greek-English Lexicon Based on Semantic Domain)
- "Thou art <u>his</u> disciple; but we are <u>disciples of Moses</u>. We know that God hath spoken unto Moses: but as for this man, <u>we know not whence he is</u>." (cf. 7:27; 8:14; and 19:9).
- Asked and answered. (7:16, 41; 8:14)
- John 9:30-31, "The man answered and said unto them, Why, herein is the marvel, that ye know not whence he is, and (yet) he opened mine eyes. We know that God heareth not sinners: but if any man be a worshipper of God, and do his will, him he heareth."

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#### Jew's reasoning: 9:16, 24-27 "This man is not from God." "We know that this man is a sinner"

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#### Blind man's reasoning: 9:17, 28-34 *"He is a prophet."* ... reviled by the Jews.

- God heareth not sinners. (9:31)
- (9.31)2) This man opened my eyes. (9:25)
- 3) If he were not of God, he could do nothing. (9:33)

John 9:32, "Since the world began it was never heard that any one opened the eyes of a man born blind."
