The Leaven of the Pharisees

Matthew 15:39-16:12; Mark 8:10-26

Jesus' warning to His disciples when they came to Him without any bread:

"Watch out and beware of the leaven of the Pharisees and Sadducees." (16:6)

- "Watch out" "properly, to stare at ... to discern clearly (physically or mentally)" (Strong)
- "Beware" "to turn one's mind or attention to a thing by being on one's guard against it" (Vine) (cf. Matthew 7:15; 2 Peter 1:19; 1 Timothy 1:4; 4:13)

They respond carnally thinking Jesus said that "because we did not eat any bread?" (16:7)

The Leaven of the Pharisees

Matthew 15:39-16:12; Mark 8:10-26

Jesus' rebuke to His disciples when they thought He spoke of their lack of bread:

"You men of little faith, why do you discuss among yourselves that you have no bread? Do you yet not understand or remember ..." (16:8-9; cf. 6:30; 8:26; 14:31)

- 1. The feeding of the 5000 and "how many baskets full you picked up?" (16:9)
- 2. The feeding of the 4000 and "how many large baskets full you picked up?" (16:10)

The Leaven of the Pharisees

Matthew 15:39-16:12; Mark 8:10-26

What should they (we) have learned from these miracles that they, by faith, should have applied here?

What was lacking in their faith?

Where was their focus? (Matthew 6:19-24)

"How is it that you do not understand that I did not speak to you concerning bread? But beware of the leaven of the Pharisees and Sadducees." (16:11)

A lack of understanding often caused by a fleshly mindset! (1 Corinthians 2:14-3:3)

The Leaven of the Pharisees Matthew 15:39-16:12: Mark 8:10-26

"Do you not yet see or understand? Do you have a hardened heart? 'HAVING EYES, DO YOU NOT SEE? AND HAVING EARS, DO YOU NOT HEAR?' And do you not remember ...?" (Mark 8:17-18)

We need:

- 1. Understanding. (Colossians 1:9; Mark 12:33; Luke 24:45; Acts 7:25)
- 2. A tender heart. (Mark 6:52; 2 Chronicles 34:27)
- 3. Spiritual vision and hearing. (Revelation 2:7)
- 4. Remembering God's provisions. (Luke 22:35; Romans 8:31-32)

The Leaven of the Pharisees

Matthew 15:39-16:12: Mark 8:10-26

"... beware of the leaven of the Pharisees and Sadducees." (16:11)

Leaven represents the **influence** of the **teaching** and hypocritical conduct of the Pharisees and Sadducees.

"A little leaven leavens the whole lump of dough." (1 Corinthians 5:6; Galatians 5:9)

What are the characteristics of leaven that we need to be cautious of?

Need for self examination: (2 Corinthians 13:5)

• Who is influencing you?

How are you being influenced?
