

## In That Very Hour ... Luke 13:31-35

The Judicial Sentence. Luke 13:31-35; 19:38; cf. Matthew 23 Herod long desired to see Jesus (Luke 9:7-9; 23:7-8, 15), but it was not likely that he desired to put Him to death. (cf. Matthew 14:1)

- 1. The antagonism between Christ and the Jewish leaders comes to a climax in Matthew 23.
- 2. In a series of woes Jesus denounces the scribes and Pharisees as Hypocrites, blind guides, fools, whited sepulchers, serpents, and  $\boldsymbol{a}$ 
  - generation of vipers. Verses 13-33.
    a. He accuses them of shutting up the kingdom of heaven against men, extortion, false teaching, lack of judgment, mercy, and
- 3. In verse 32 Jesus declares, "Fill ye up then the measure of your fathers."

  a. This generation of Jews will fill up the cup to overflowing.

  - b. With the rejection of God's son and the crucifixion approaching, the patience of God had come to an end.
